

QSAN XN5004R is a powerful NAS system which is designed for both enterprise and SMB users. The system hardware features the Intel Celeron CPU and up to 64GB of DDR4 RAM. The additional PCIe slots also delivered to enhance the performance and scale up with expansion enclosures. Combined with the latest hardware technology, the XN5004R is able to fulfill various demands efficiently. Following is the feature list of XN5004R:



3.1. Install the Disk Drive in the Tray

3.1.1. Tools and Parts for Drive Installation


- · A screwdriver (Phillips #1)
- At least one 3.5" or 2.5" SATA drive (please visit <u>http://www.qsan.com</u> for compatible drive models).

Please ensure that there is no data on the disk to prevent important data being formatted.



3.1.3. Install the Disk Drive (LFF)

- 1. Open the drive tray.
 - ① Push the release button from right to left to open the carrier handle.




(2) Hold the carrier handle and pull out the disk drive tray, repeat the steps above to remove other disk drive trays.






- 2. Install a 3.5" HDD into an LFF tray
 - ① Place the drive on the tray
 - (2) Secure the drive from the four spots indicate below with four #6-32 screws provided in the accessory box.



- 3. Install a 2.5" SSD into an LFF tray
 - ① Place the drive in the blue area (shown below) of the tray.
 - Turn the tray upside down and secure the drive from the bottom of the tray with four M3 screws provided in the accessory box.






- 4. Install a LFF tray into the XCubeNAS.
 - 1 Insert the loaded drive tray into the empty drive bay all the way to the back until the carrier handle can be closed.



2 Push the disk drive lock from right to left to lock the drive tray.





TIP:

Make sure the tray is pushed in all the way, otherwise the drive might not function properly.

5. Repeat the steps above to install all prepared drives.




3.1.4. Install the Disk Drive (SFF)

- 1. Remove the SFF tray from the system.
 - ① Hold down the release button and pull out the disk drive tray from the XCubeNAS.



- 2. Install a 2.5" SSD into a SFF tray
 - 1 Place the SSD in the drive tray.
 - Turn the tray upside down and secure the drive from the bottom of the tray with four M3 screws provided in the accessory box.





- 3. Install a SFF tray into the system
 - (1) Insert the loaded drive tray into the empty drive bay all the way to the back until you hear a "click" sound.



2 Push the disk drive lock from left to right to lock the drive tray.





3.2. Upgrade Memory




CAUTION:

- The following instructions should only be performed by an authorized and trained technician. Strictly adhere to the instructions to install a RAM module on the NAS.
- Before you start, please ensure that you turn off the NAS, disconnect the power adapter, network cable(s), and also remove any other device/cable that is attached to the NAS.

XN5004R is installed with a 4GB DDR4 memory module by default. If you want to install, check, or remove a memory module on your XCubeNAS, please follow the steps as illustrated below:

- 1. Shutdown your XCubeNAS and disconnect power adapter, network cable(s) or any other device/cable that is attached to your system to prevent any possible damages.
- 2. Remove the rear top cover.
 - ① Loosen the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.
 - 2 Pull the rear top cover, and put it aside.






CAUTION:

When you remove the rear top cover, the sensitive internal components are exposed. Please avoid touching anything other than the memory module when you add or remove a memory module.



- 3. Insert a new memory module into the slot.
 - ① Push the retaining clips on the slot out to the sides.
 - 2 Align the notch on the gold edge of the module with the notch in the memory slot.
 - ③ Push down on the memory module with firm and even pressure. The retaining clips will snap into position as the module is correctly inserted.



- 4. Put back the rear top cover you lifted in step 2.
 - ① Align the pin at the side of the rear top cover with the slots on the chassis' edge, and push the rear top cover back in position.



2 Put back and fasten the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.



- 5. Remove memory module
 - ① Follow step 1 and 2 above to shut down your XCubeNAS, and disconnect the cables, and then remove the rear top cover.
 - 2 Disengage the memory retaining clips by pushing them outwards, and the module will pop out of the slot.
 - 3 Follow step 4 above to put back the top cover.

To ensure the system stability, you MUST install genuine QSAN memory modules for system memory size expansion.

TIP:

In order to achieve dual-channel RAM performance, it is suggested that you install memory modules with the same capacity in pairs.

Pair 1: Slot #1 and Slot #3

Pair 2: Slot #2 and Slot #4

Memory module support:

1 RAM: Supports one module inserted into any slot as single-channel memory configuration.



- **2 RAMs:** Supports two modules inserted into slot #1 and slot #3 or slot #2 and slot #4 as one pair of dual-channel memory configuration.
- **4 RAMs:** Supports four modules inserted into all the slots as two pairs of dual-channel memory configuration.



3.3. Install the Optional Adapter Card

Your XCubeNAS supports a PCIe add-on adapter cards that demand high bandwidth and capacity expansion, PCIe Gen3 x8, marked on the back of your XCubeNAS. You may need to replace the high profile bracket (suited for PC) in your adapter card with the low profile bracket before installing the card on your XCubeNAS. To install the adapter card, please follow the steps as illustrated below:

- 1. Shutdown your XCubeNAS and disconnect power adapter, network cable(s) or any other device/cable that is attached to your system to prevent any possible damages.
- 2. Remove the rear top cover.
 - 1 Loosen the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.
 - 2 Pull the rear top cover, and put it aside.






CAUTION:


When you remove the rear top cover, the sensitive internal components are exposed. Please avoid touching any irrelevent components to prevent damage.



- 3. Install the riser card.
 - ① Align the riser card's connector with the expansion slot, and push down to insert the card into the slot.
 - ② Fasten the screws provided in the riser card package to secure the riser card.




- 4. Install the adapter card.
 - ① Remove the screw on the bracket that secures the expansion slot's cover.
 - 2 Lift the bracket and the expansion slot's cover.





3 Align the card's connector with the riser card, and insert the card into the slot.





CAUTION:

Make sure the connector is fully inserted. Otherwise, the network expansion card might not be able to function properly.

- Put back and fasten the screw that you removed in step 4-1 to secure the newly inserted card.
- 5. For thunderbolt 3 adapter card only, connect the cable from the adapter card to the mainboard.
 - Align the connectors. Please make sure that the position is the same as the figure shown below.



2 Push to connect the cable and the connectors.



- 6. Put back the rear top cover you lifted in step 2.
 - ① Align the pin at the side of the rear top cover with the slots on the chassis' edge, and push the rear top cover back in position.



2 Put back and fasten the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.


3.4. Replace System Fan

If a system fan failed to function, please see the instructions below to open the XCubeNAS and replace the malfunctioning fan:

- 1. Shutdown your XCubeNAS and disconnect power adapter, network cable(s) or any other device/cable that is attached to your system to prevent any possible damages.
- 2. Remove the rear top cover.
 - 1 Loosen the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.
 - 2 Pull the rear top cover, and put it aside.



3. Hold both ends of the fan module and lift it upwards to remove it.





- 4. Prepare a new fan module and replace the system with the new fan module.
 - ① Align the connectors on and fan module to the connector on the mainboard.
 - Slide the fan module into the fan holder rail. Make sure both sides are aligned properly as illustrated below.



- 5. Put back the rear top cover you lifted in step 2.
 - ① Align the pin at the side of the rear top cover with the slots on the chassis' edge, and push the rear top cover back in position.




2 Put back and fasten the screw on the back of the XCubeNAS.



3.5. Replace Malfunctioning PSU

XCubeNAS comes with two redundant Power Supply Units (PSU) that can be hot swapped when the PSU is not functioning. If a PSU or its fan failed to function, please see the instructions below to replace the malfunctioning PSU:



1. Unplug the power cord from the PSU to be replaced.




TIP:

A long beep sound will be heard if only one PSU is functioning. You can press the Beep Off Button on the PSU to silence the beeping sound.



- 2. Remove the PSU from XCubeNAS.
 - ① Push the lever of the PSU at the back panel in the indicated direction.
 - 2 Pull out the PSU from the XCubeNAS.





3. Prepare a new PSU, and push it back to the slot until you hear a click. Please make sure that the direction of the PSU is correctly installed, to prevent any potential damage by improper installation.

3.6. Install the Rail Kits


Rail kit is an optional accessory XCubeNAS, if you did not purchase QSAN qualified rail kit, you can skip the steps of the system installation tasks. If you want to purchase QSAN qualified rail kit: full extension and thin slide with tool-less bracket: AA612508 series, please contact QSAN authorized reseller.



CAUTION:


The populated XCubeNAS system can be very heavy, to avoid any potential injury or harm to installers, or damage to the system, we strongly recommend at least two certified operators or engineers perform the system installation.

1. Pull the inner rail out and slide the intermediate rail back.






2. Install the inner member onto the chassis.




3. Install the outer rail/bracket assembly to the frame. Repeat this step for the other side.






 Use two M5 screws to fasten the bracket to the rail kit, one on each rail. (For the complete safety, you can use four optional M4 screws to fasten the bracket to the rail kit.)



- 5. Insert the chassis to complete the installation.
 - ① Pull the middle member fully extended in locked position.
 - 2 Ensure ball bearing retainer is located at the front of the middle member.
 - (3) Insert chassis into the middle-outer member.
 - ④ When hitting the stop, pull/push release tab to unlock and retract chassis into rack.
 - (5) Pull the chassis into position and ensure the chassis ear is located on the chassis. (The chassis ear allows you to drag out the chassis from its position without any screws.)






3.7. Connect the System to the Host

XN5004R has four onboard 1Gbps LAN ports for host connections. You can learn more about the path configuration in cabling for XN5004R by following images:

a. One LAN connection



b. Multiple LAN connections

3.8. Start Up Your System

Before you power on your XCubeNAS for the first time, please make sure the following tasks are done:

- 1. Connect one end of each power cord to the power ports located on the back of the XCubeNAS and the other end to a power outlet.
- 2. Connect at least one LAN cable to one of the LAN ports and the other end to your switch, router, or hub.



3. Press the power button to turn on your XCubeNAS.



Your XCubeNAS is now online and detectable from a network computer.

INFORMATION:

The power cord rating is the minimum requirement. The rating of the power cord that you purchase must equal to or be higher than the minimum requirement to ensure the system safety and reliability.



INFORMATION:

The Following are the operational conditions for XN5004R:

Temperature:

- Operating temperature 0 to 40°C
- Shipping temperature -10°C to 50°C
- Operating Relative Humidity 20% to 80% non-condensing
- Non-Operating Relative Humidity 10% to 90%

4. Discover and Install QSM

After hardware setup is finished, the next step is to discover the system on the network and start the initial configuration. To discover and install the QSAN Storage Manager (QSM), please follow the steps below:


- 1. Power on the XCubeNAS.
- 2. Open a web browser on your computer connected to the same local area network as XCubeNAS, and use either of the following methods on the browser:

6. Reset to Default

If you want to reset XCubeNAS to factory default, there are several options to choose from. Please follow the steps below:

Reset to default by using the reset button on the back of XCubeNAS:



- Reset network settings: Press and hold the reset button on the rear panel for **3 seconds**, a short beep sound for 1 second will be heard. The administrator password and all the network settings will be reset, the system configuration will result in:
 - Reset Admin password to the default value: 1234.
 - All networking set to "DHCP".
 - All data service ports set to default setting (All data service enable and set to default port).
 - VLAN will be terminated.
 - Vswitch will be deleted.
 - Port trunking will be disabling.
 - After configs are deleted, restart the XCubeNAS.
 - Log out QSAN Cloud.
 - DNS settings.
 - DDNS and UPNP settings.
- 2. Reset all settings: Press and hold the reset button on the rear panel for **10 seconds**, you will hear a short beep sound at the third second and a long beep sound at the tenth second. The operating system (including reset the administrator password and all the network settings) will be reinstalled, the system configuration will result in:
 - Reset all network settings to factory default.
 - Reset all system settings to factory default.
 - All accounts, groups, folder permission, and ACL are deleted.









10.1. Replace Fan Module

The XCubeNAS comes with tool-less fan module which can be easily changed when the fan failed. If a fan failed to function, you can check the fan status on QSM. Please go to **Monitor app**→ **Hardware**. The System Health and Fan Speed will show "Error" if failed. You can also check the status by clicking **Dashboard** on the top right corner on the desktop. The System Status will also display "Error" and its message, "Fan(No.) is not functioning".



If you see the error message shown above, which means your fan module needed to be replaced immediately. To replace the malfunction fan module, please refer to <u>chapter 3.4</u> <u>Replace System Fan</u>. After the new fan module is successfully installed, you can see the fan speed displaying its Revolutions Per Minute(RPM) value on QSM.

10.2. Replace Power Supply Unit

XCubeNAS comes with two redundant Power Supply Units (PSU) that can be hot swapped it when the PSU is not functioning. If a PSU or its fan failed to function, you can check the PSU status in two ways:

- 1. On PSU: the PSU LED will turn to color amber.
- In QSM: Please go to Monitor app → Hardware. The PSU status will show "Error" if failed. You can also check the status by clicking Dashboard on the top right corner on the desktop. The System Status will also display "Error" and its message, "PSU(No.) is not functioning".
